Public Health Update	Hepatitis Update A Health Advisory was recently issued by the CDC regarding a cluster of children identified with hepatitis and adenovirus infection. A total of nine pediatric patients with hepatitis of unknown etiology and adenovirus infection were identified at an Alabama hospital from October 2021 to February 2022. Adenovirus type 41 was sequenced from 5 patients. In April, the United Kingdom Security Health Agency communicated with the CDC that they have also noted an increase of acute pediatric hepatitis of unknown etiology. In the UK, adenovirus infection was detected in 75% of the cases tested and serotype 41f was also found. The WHO is reporting at least 169 cases of this hepatitis of unknown etiology in children across 12 countries, as of April 21, 2022. The CDC has issued the following recommendations: 1. Clinicians should consider adenovirus testing in pediatric patients with hepatitis of unknown etiology. NAAT (e.g. PCR) is preferable and may be done on respiratory specimens, stool or rectal swabs, or blood. 2. Anecdotal reports suggest that testing whole blood by PCR may be more sensitive than testing plasma by PCR; therefore, testing of whole blood could be considered in those without an etiology who tested negative for adenovirus in plasma samples. The CDC is requesting notification from clinicians or state public health authorities of	
	 or without any adenovirus testing results, independent of the results) since October 1, 2021. Please notify your local health department if you have a case in your facility that falls under these parameters. Patient Transfer Communication In recent weeks, health departments in North Texas have received increased reports that concerned us. Patients with MDRO history were transferred from one healthcare 	

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	 facility to another, but the need for transmission-based precautions was not communicated to the care team at the new facility. Therefore, the new facility was not using precautions which led to potential exposures and transmission of the MDRO. We know that most facilities have a process in place for communication of isolation needs to occur between staff in the transfer departments and between the physicians involved in the transfer of care. However, knowing that some recent communication fall outs have led to the transmission of infections and colonization to other patients, we encourage infection preventionists to review transfer communication processes with your facility's transfer team to ensure that patients' isolation needs are being communicated. IPs can also help by calling the IP at the receiving facility to notify him/her of the patient's history. Please also include public health in your communication process, as needed.
