8/3 To OR for the following procedures:

ODT80ZZ Resection of Small Intestine, Open Approach (SB)

ODTF0ZZ Resection of Right Large Intestine, Open Approach (COLO)

OWQF0ZZ Repair Abdominal Wall, Open Approach (HER)

OWCP0ZZ Extirpation of Matter from GI Tract, Open Approach (XLAP)

ODJD8ZZ Inspection of Lower Intestinal Tract, Endo (non-NHSN procedure)

OD9670Z Drainage of Stomach with Drainage Device (non-NHSN procedure)

9/8 H&P: Patient states the abdominal pain started about 3 days ago and has been persistent since. Nausea and vomiting for the last day. Presents with 3 days of abdominal pain and 1 day of N/V

9/10 progress note: midline wound w/ purulent drainage from 2 areas, will open, drain, pack and send culture

9/10 abdominal midline wound culture: MRSA

7/12 To OR for the following procedure:

OSRC0J9 Replace of R Knee Jt with Synth Sub, Cement, Open (KPRO)

7/18 C-reactive protein: 11.8 mg/L

7/22 H&P: small area of incision that seems to continue to scab and fall off and does not seem to be healing. No active drainage. Plan: inflammatory markers were significantly elevated. recommend I&D

7/23 op note: I&D deep to subcu tissue. Findings: No purulent fluid. Appeared to be a stitch abscess.

Does the patient have an SSI? No, stitch abscess
